WHAT DOES IT COST?

Registration is \$350 per camper (\$425 for non affiliates). Some affiliated unions subsidize this cost- check with your union local.

Full registration is payable upon confirmation of camp attendance.

Arrangement for payment by the union is the responsibility of the camper's parent(s).

The SFL covers the cost of wages for Recreation Staff and Youth Activity Coordinators and other expenses relating to course material and activities.

Arrangements can be made to ensure no one is excluded because of cost.

DETAILS

The camp will begin Sunday afternoon, August 8, and end the following Saturday morning, August 14.

Staff at our camp include Youth Activity Coordinators, Rec Staff, Counsellors, and a Camp Nurse.
